
Nouns can be countable or uncountable. Countable nouns can be counted, e.g. one gas station, two gas stations, etc.


Uncountable nouns cannot be counted, e.g. air, rice, water, bread, money, information, furniture coffee, advice, etc.

When you learn a new noun, you should check if it is countable or uncountable and note how it is used in a sentence.



Quantifiers are used to describe different amounts of things. (e.g., a lot, a few, any, many, much, none).

Quantifiers; how many and how much Count nouns Noncount nouns Are there many restaurants? Is there much crime? Yes, there are a lot. Yes, there's a lot. There's a little. There are a few. No, there isn't much. No, there aren't many. No, there aren't any. No, there isn't any. No, there are none. No, there's none. **How much** crime is there? **How many** restaurants are there?

There's a lot of crime.

How are *a lot, any* and *none* similar?

A= are similar in that they are used for plural quantifiers
