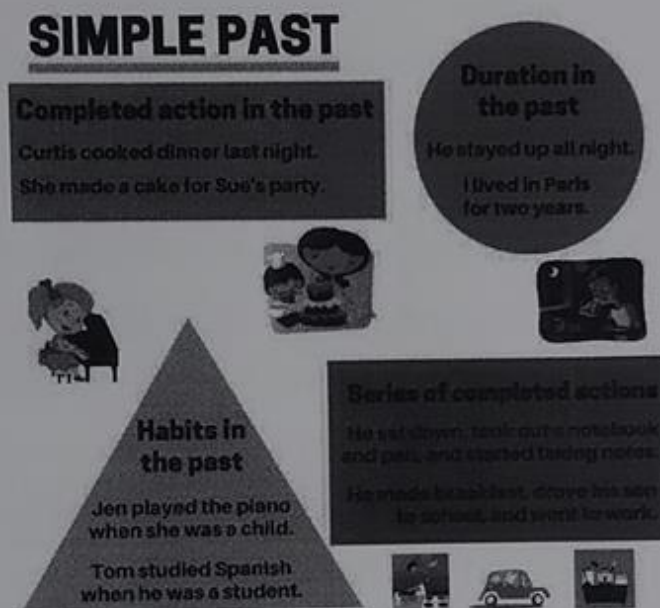

UNIT 7 – WE WENT DANCING – SIMPLE PAST
GRAMMAR – QUESTIONS

Dear students, during the week we will practice the **simple past tense**. You will learn how to make and answer questions about past events.

ACTIVITY 1 – REMEMBER

Review the information about when to use the simple past.



Utilizamos el **pasado simple** para:

- Hablar de una acción o una serie de acciones que ocurrieron en el pasado.
 - *I went to the movies last weekend. / Fui al cine el fin de semana pasado.*
 - *My father took a shower, ate breakfast and went to work. / Mi papa se tomó un baño, comió el desayuno y se fue a trabajar.*
- Hablar de acciones que ocurrieron durante un período de tiempo en el pasado.
 - *I lived in Mérida for two years. / Yo viví en Mérida por dos años.*
- Hablar de cosas que solíamos hacer en el pasado.
 - *She played the piano when she was a child. / Ella tocó el piano cuando era niña.*
 - *Tom studied Spanish when he was a student. / Tom estudió español cuando era estudiante.*

ACTIVITY 2 – SIMPLE PAST QUESTIONS – 20 PTS.

Recuerda que hay dos tipos de preguntas, aquellas en las que la respuesta es SI o NO (**yes/no questions**) y aquellas en las que se pide mayor información sobre un evento (**information questions or wh- questions**). Es importante mencionar que en preguntas el verbo se utiliza en su forma **simple**, es decir, **NO SE CAMBIA AL PASADO** puesto que el auxiliar **DID** ya nos indica que se está hablando de algo que ya sucedió.

- Match the questions with the correct answer and write them in your notebook.

What did you watch on T.V last weekend?	I saw my friends Laura and Erick.
Did you have eggs for breakfast today?	No, I didn't. I had coffee and a toast.
Where did you go on your last vacation?	Yes, they did.
Did your father work yesterday?	We watched horror movies.
Who did you see at the party?	No, she didn't.
Did your friends go to the cinema last Sunday?	At 10:00 p.m.
When did you finish the project?	I finished at midnight, it was really difficult.
Did Lisa study for the Math test?	Yes, we did. We washed all the clothes.
What time did your mother go to bed last night?	I went to Puerto Vallarta for a week.
Did you and your family do the laundry last week?	

Example: What did you watch on T.V last weekend? We watched horror movies.

ACTIVITY 3 – YES/NO QUESTIONS – 30 PTS.

Para elaborar preguntas sobre eventos pasados utilizamos el auxiliar DID. En preguntas donde la respuesta es SI o NO utilizamos el auxiliar DID al principio de la siguiente manera:

DID + SUBJECT + VERB IN THE SIMPLE FORM + COMPLEMENT AND/OR TIME EXPRESSION?

Example. Did you go to school yesterday?

Para responder de forma corta se utilizan las expresiones: Yes, ___ DID. o No, ___ didn't.

8. Did you go to school two days ago? No, I didn't.
9. Did you listen to music yesterday afternoon? Yes, I did.
10. Did you and your friends go dancing last weekend? No, we didn't.

- Write five more yes/no questions in your notebook to use them in class next Wednesday.

ACTIVITY 3 – INFORMATION QUESTIONS – 30 PTS.

En preguntas donde pedimos mayor información sobre un suceso (qué, quién, cuándo, donde, etcétera), agregamos la pregunta (WH- word) al principio y seguimos la misma estructura, es decir:

WH- WORD + DID + SUBJECT + VERB IN THE SIMPLE FORM + COMPLEMENT AND/OR TIME EXPRESSION?

Para responder se utilizan afirmaciones con la información solicitada (el verbo va en pasado puesto que es una afirmación).

Example. Where did you go last weekend? I went to my grandma's house.

- Why did you pass your English test? I passed because I studied all night.
- What time did your best friend get up today? He got up at nine o'clock.

ACTIVITY 4 – QUESTIONS – 20 PTS.

- Complete these conversations in your notebook.

- A: Did you stay (stay) home on Sunday?

B: No, I called (call) my friend Anna. We drove (drive) to a nice little restaurant for lunch.
- A: How did you spent (spend) your last birthday?

B: I had (have) a party. Everyone enjoyed (enjoy) it, but the neighbors next door not, taste (not, like) the noise.
- A: What did you did (do) last night?

B: I saw (see) a sci-fi movie at the Cineplex. I loved (love) it! Amazing special effects!
- A: Did you did (do) anything special over the weekend?

B: Yes, I did. I went (go) shopping. Unfortunately, I spent (spend) all my money. Now I'm broke!
- A: Did you went (go) out on Friday night?

B: No, I didn't. I invited (invite) friends over, and I cooked (cook) spaghetti for them.
