


Para hablar en singular:

- THERE IS NOT / THERE ISN'T: Ex. There isn't a gas station near my house. /
 No hay una estación de gasolina cerca de mi casa.



• Para hablar en plural:

- THERE ARE: Ex. *There are* many schools on Musa Boulevard. / Hay muchas escuelas en el boulevard Musa.
- THERE AREN'T (ARE NOT) ANY: Ex. There aren't any newsstands on the main street. / No hay revisterías en la calle principal.

- **HOW MANY** para sustantivos contables. *Ex. How many sisters do you have? / ¿Cuántas hermanas tienes? I have 3 sisters.*
- **HOW MUCH** para sustantivos no contables. *Ex. How much noise is there in your neighborhood?* / ¿Cuánto ruido hay en tu vecindario? There is a lot of noise.
