UNIT 2 PROJECT "PASSIVE VOICE"

Aim: Give Ss practice using the passive voice in present simple and simple past.

Prepare:

- **PART 1:** Look for *three famous paintings* and try to recreate them with things you have at home. Find some interesting facts about the paintings such as author, year of creation, place where it is kept, etcetera.
- **PART 2:** Choose a *city or state from Mexico* and find interesting facts about it: typical food, alternative names, production of different items, interesting places, etcetera.

Present:

- **PART 1:** Make a Word document; include the three original famous paintings and your pictures. Write facts about the painting using the *passive voice for simple past*. Remember the example you saw in our conference. You must write *at least three sentences per painting*.
- <u>PART 2:</u> Once you have enough information about the city or state you chose, write a review about this place. You must write <u>at least 100 words and use the passive voice in present simple</u>. Remember the examples you saw in our conference. Check spelling and the use of capital letters and punctuation marks.
- Upload your Word document to Escuela en Red.
