Future with *be going to* and *will*

Use *be going to* + verb for plans you've decided on.

What are you **going to do**?

I'm **going to relax** at the beach.

We're **going to go** surfing every day.

I'm not **going to do** anything special.

Use *will* + verb for possible plans before you've made a decision.

What are you **going to do**?

I'm not sure. I **guess** I'll just **stay** home.

Maybe I'll **take** a course.

I don't know. I **think** I'll **go** camping.

I **probably won't go** anywhere.

▶ Modals for necessity and suggestion

Describing necessity

You **must** have health insurance.

You **need to** be 21 or over.

You **have to** get a passport.

You **don't have to** get vaccinations.

Giving suggestions

You'd **better** avoid the stalls on the street.

You **ought to** make a copy of your passport.

You **should** try some local specialties.

You **shouldn't** carry a lot of cash.
