Use be going to + verb for plans you've decided on.

What are you going to do?

I'm going to relax at the beach.

We're going to go surfing every day.

I'm not going to do anything special.

Use will + verb for possible plans before you've made a decision.

What are you going to do?

I'm not sure. I guess I'll just stay home.

Maybe I'll take a course.

I don't know. I think I'll go camping.

I probably won't go anywhere.

Describing necessity

You must have health insurance.

You need to be 21 or over.

You have to get a passport.

You don't have to get vaccinations.

Giving suggestions

You'd better avoid the stalls on the street.

You ought to make a copy of your passport.

You shouldn't carry a lot of cash.
